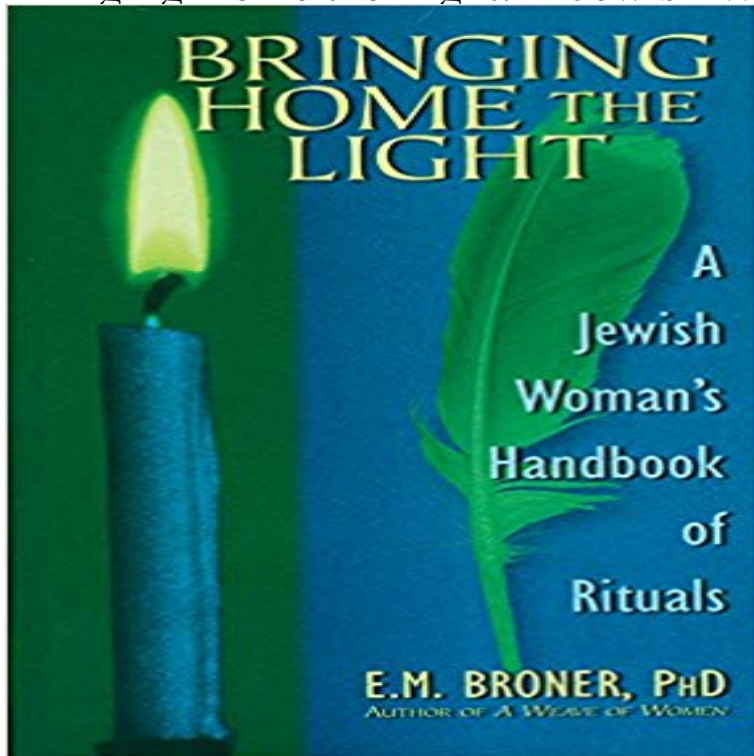


Bringing Home the Light: A Jewish Women's Handbook of Ritual
