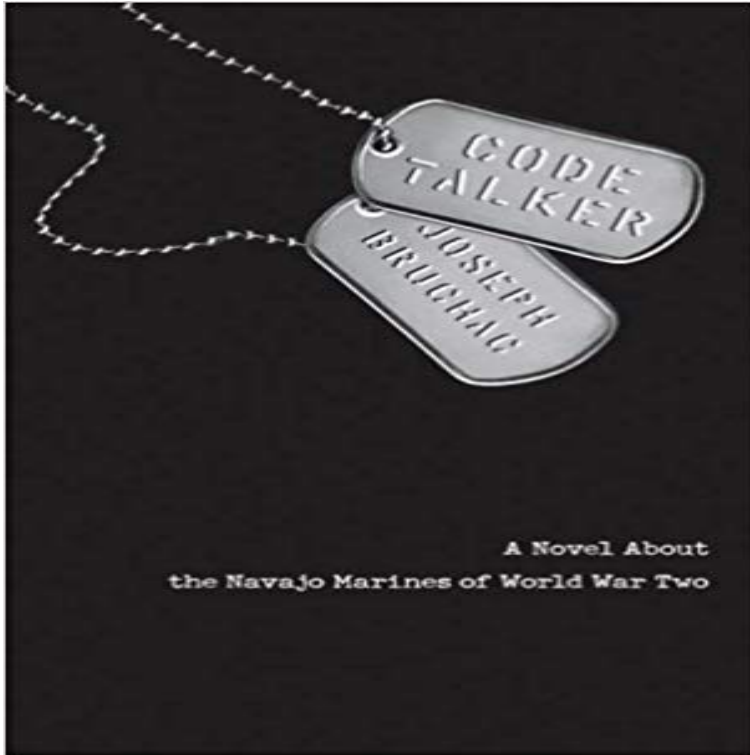


# Code Talker: A Novel About the Navajo Marines of World War Two
