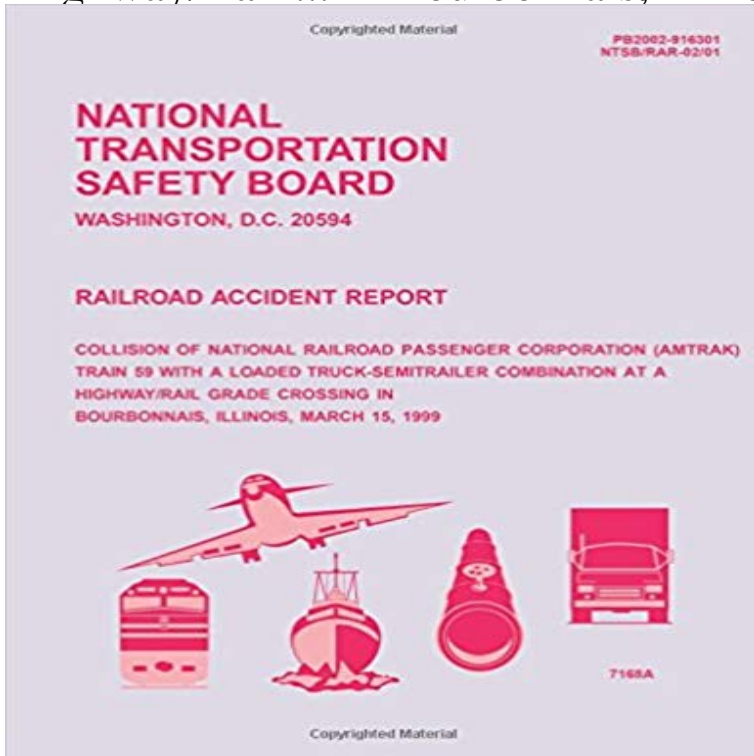

About 9:47 p.m. on March 15, 1999, National Railroad Passenger Corporation train 29, with 207 passengers and 21 Amtrak or other railroad employees on board and operating on Illinois Central Railroad main line tracks, struck and destroyed the loaded trailer of a tractor-semitrailer combination that was traversing the McKnight Road grade crossing in Bourbonnais, Illinois.
