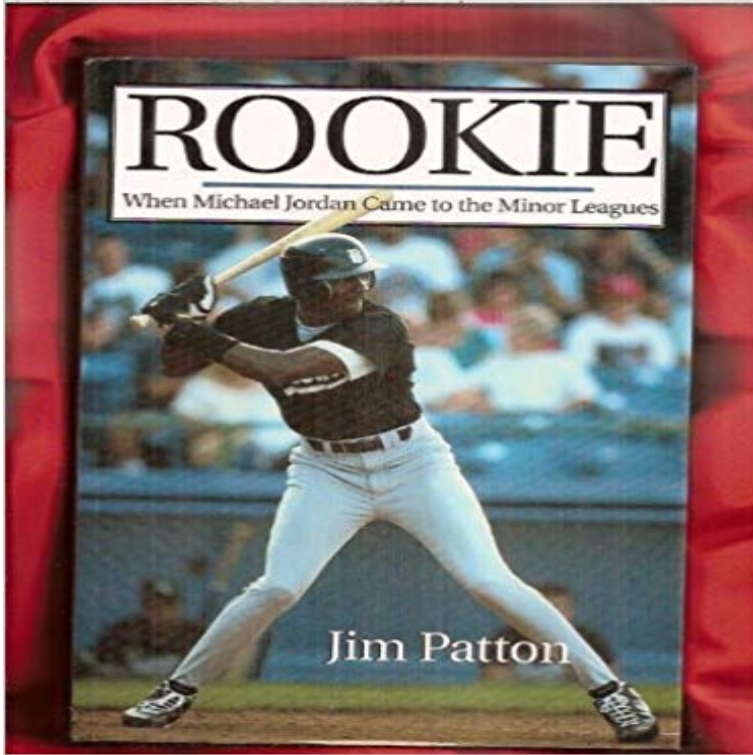


Rookie: When Michael Jordan Came to the Minor Leagues
