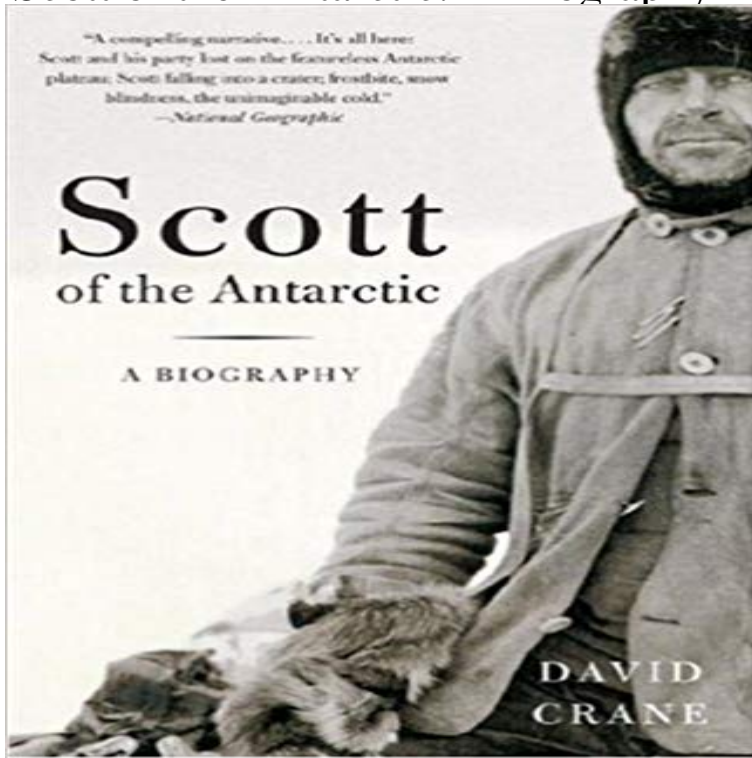


Scott of the Antarctic: A Biography
