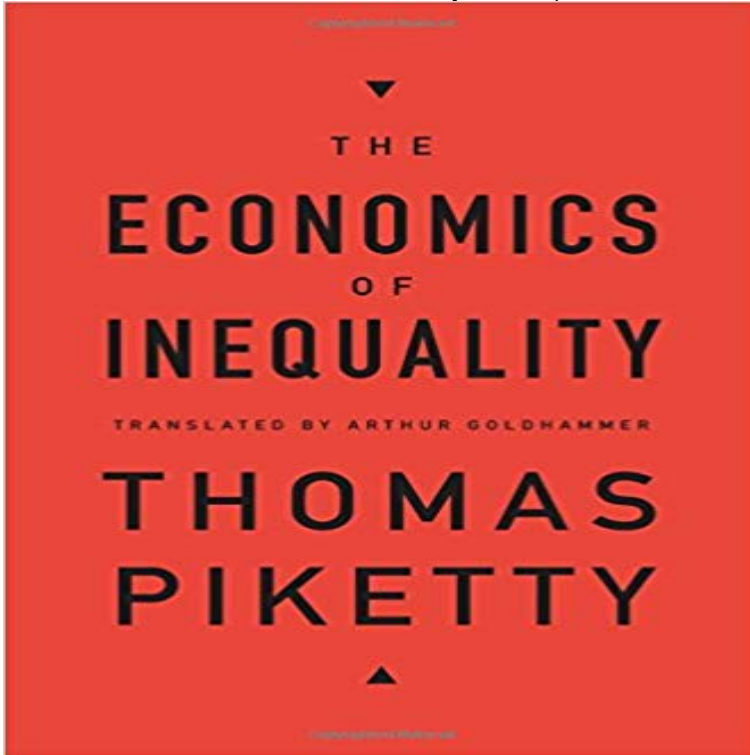


The Economics of Inequality
